Todd Kreidler is a writer and director whose work spans Broadway, Off-Broadway, film, television, regional theaters, and immersive entertainment. Known for his “unlikely” collaborations, he bridges disciplines and cultures, creating stories that resonate worldwide.

He began his career at Pittsburgh Public Theater where he found early mentorship at the Pittsburgh Public Theater, where he met and began a lasting collaboration with the legendary playwright August Wilson. Later, he served as Associate Artistic Director at Kenny Leon’s True Colors Theatre Company, where he co-founded the national August Wilson Monologue Competition. His stage adaptation of *Guess Who’s Coming to Dinner* has been produced at over 100 regional theaters. He also created the Broadway musical *Holler If Ya Hear Me*, featuring the words and music of Tupac Shakur. His screenwriting debut, *Mahalia*, earned an Emmy nomination. Kreidler continues to develop works for screen and stage.
